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There was continual movement in the novel, which took the reader back to the past and the previous anguish that had led to the opening moments of the novel. Courage, honor, truth, sincerity, independence were all aspects of a male ideal. Wollstonecraft is best known for A Vindication of the Rights of Woman in which she argues that women are not naturally inferior to men, but appear to be only because they lack education.
